Much of this is **speculation** and should be taken as such



- Dividing up submissions among sub-panel members
- Reading the submission and interpreting quantitative information
- Use score sheets for environment and esteem
- Deciding on which papers will be read (or outputs 'scrutinised') and agreeing between those responsible for the submission

- Going through submission
- Downloading and reading where appropriate
- Filling in 'mark sheet' for each output also notes to support decision-making
- Cross checking individual statements (additional information) in support of papers
- Chasing down external information about venue, paper etc



- Collating marks
- Agreeing marks and discussion
- Reviewing controversial areas
- Normalising and calculation of profile components
- Assembly of overall profile
- Iteration (probably)



What I am going to need:

- Time!
- Dynamic statistical overviews
- Submissions that are easy to navigate
- Scoring and information views aligned
- Accurate and informative additional information
- Easy tracing back, bookmarking and annotation
